

## Meanings of Common Names and Name-Elements in Old Norse

**Note** that most names are compounds of the elements presented here, and that no particularly connected meaning is implied by compounding them together; they are only supposed to sound cool. Thus one should not read anything too meaningful into names like *Hildigunn*, “war-war,” (or *Guðfríð*, “war-peace”!).

The gender which the name element is associated with is marked where applicable, but is only relevant to the second part of a compound name - e.g. *Gunnar* includes the feminine word *gunn* but is a masculine name because the second element *-ar* is masculine. Elements followed by -, e.g. *Ás-*, typically occur just as the first part of a compound; elements preceded by -, e.g. *-ung*, usually just occur as the second part of a compound.

Simple names may often be formed by taking most of the word elements below and adding an *-i* to make a man’s name and an *-a* to make a woman’s name (e.g. the man’s name *Helgi* and the woman’s name *Helga*).
